

# WHO WAS ALICE KYTELER?

woman to be condemned for
witchcraft in Ireland. She was accused
of sorcery and demonism by her
stepchildren who were jealous of
Alice's wealth which she had
accumulated after being married and
widowed four times.
Her stepchildren brought their claims
to Richard Ledrede, Bishop of Ossory.

Alice, along with some of her associates was tried and convicted of heresy but, being a very wealthy woman, was rumoured to have escaped Ireland. Her maid Petronella de Meath was not so fortunate and confessed to crimes of heresy after she was tortured under church law. She was found guilty and was burned at the stake on the 3rd of November
