
LOCAL FOOD SHOWCASED

YOUNG SOLDIER TRIBUTE

Thomas Woodgate from Mill Street, Callan, Co. Kilkenny was only 14 years old when he died in October 1918. He was the youngest official Irish casualty from the 26 Counties who died as a result of enemy fire in World War 1 1914 - 1918. Thomas Woodgate drowned along with 500 other souls when the *RMS Leinster* was struck by three torpedoes fired from the German Submarine, UB 123, just off the Kish lighthouse on October 10th 1918 at almost a month to the day before the end of the war. The Kilkenny Great War Memorial Committee are unveiling a new sculpture dedicated to Thomas Woodgate. Be sure to look out for it in the Market Yard when out and about in Kilkenny.
