

ilkenny Library offers a diverse selection of travel books and travel guides that transport readers to distant lands without leaving the comfort of their homes, or even their own armchair!



"All the Wide Border" by Mike Parker






"Elsewhere" by *Rosita Boland*


"The Slow Train to Tehran" by *Rebecca Lowe*

To keep you entertained on the long haul flight or on your sunbed there is a


