Ireland is the only country in the world to have a national day celebrating young people's creativity. This year, Kilkenny County Council Library Service has organised events across our library branch network running from Tuesday June 3rd-Saturday June 7th.

We kick off the festivities on Tuesday June 3rd with an Introduction to Game Development for Teens in the Mayfair library facilitated by Cartoon Saloon's Gary Chadwick. This workshop will introduce the building blocks of game development using Scratch, a visual scripting engine. The workshop is aimed at 15-18year olds and runs from 5.30-7.30pm.

On Wednesday June 4th, Messy Adventures: Mobile Role Play Village will create a wonderland for your young child with a miniature village complete with IO destinations. Your child can explore a construction site, emergency Room, house, garden, post office, cafe, vets, theatre, supermarket & hairdressers. Two sessions run from 1.30-2.30 & 3-4pm Suitable for children 1-6 years. Please phone Mayfair Library or email to book your child's space.



Ferrybank Library will host a Pottery Workshop Wednesday 4th June from 4-5pm. This is suitable for children age 7-12 years and will enable your child to unleash their Inner Artist, creating their own bespoke coil pot with Firefly Pottery. On Friday June 6th we welcome author and illustrator Alan Nolan to Loughboy Library where you can "Design Your Own Superhero" in a Storytelling & Illustration event. This runs from 4-5pm and is suitable for 8-12 years.


