


Traditionally images were presented as hard copy photographs to be viewed by members of the public. For many years now, Kilkenny County Council Library Service has an ongoing programme of digitising Kilkenny based images and making them available to the widest available audience. Lawrence Collection-originally consisted of 40,000 glass plate negatives from 1870-1914. The photographs were produced commercially and capture scenes of that period throughout Ireland. Many afterwards were reproduced as pic-



ture postcards. The bulk of the outdoor images were taken by Robert French, the Lawrences' chief photographer. Kilkenny Local Studies holds a selection of City and County images.



Lawrence Reproduction-this initiative, in 1990, involved getting some original Lawrence sites photographed professionally around the City and County of Kilkenny

Crawford Collection-were taken by



the archaeologist Osbert Guy Stanhope Crawford in 1946. The Local Studies department has a selection of both City and County images. The image shows what High St looked during this period.

Valentine Collection- this national collection dates between 1900-1960 and was generated mainly for Tourism promotion. Local Studies has a selection of Kilkenny City and County images.

**Aerofilms** -aerial Photographs mainly of the City (mid 1960s)

Amenity Study Photographs-these were taken of streetscapes (circa 1970). They are available on the Kilkenny Digital Archive


**Bord Failte Photographs**-Kilkenny City and County (mid 1970s)

Industrial Archaeological Survey Photographs-the Survey itself was carried out by Fred Hammond. This important collection covers Kilkenny's rich catalogue of industrial sites including bridges, mills etc. It dates from 1989.
