




# Kilkenny Libraries Invite You to

ibraries across Kilkenny are preparing to celebrate **National Public Libraries Open Day** on **Saturday, 27 September**, with a vibrant programme of events designed to showcase the modern, inclusive, and community-focused services they offer. This year's theme, **"Take a Closer Look,"** invites everyone to rediscover their local library as a space for learning, creativity, and connection.



From straw crafting and seed saving to silent reading, Kilkenny's libraries are offering something for everyone—whether you're a seasoned library member or visiting for the first time.

### A County-Wide Celebration

In **Mayfair Library**, readers can enjoy the calming atmosphere of a **Silent Book Club** from **11am to 12:30pm**. There's no as-



signed reading—just bring your favourite book and enjoy quiet time with fellow bookworms. The event marks the launch of a new monthly series running through the winter.

Castlecomer Library will host a unique Crafting with Cornflowers mandala workshop with eco-artist Edel Ní Nualláin at 11am. Participants will learn about the endangered native cornflower and its revival, while creating beautiful eco-art inspired by nature. Booking is required.

Over in **Grai**guenamanagh, Monica Fleming returns for
a **Seed Saving Work-**shop from **10am to 12pm**,
where she'll share practical
tips on harvesting and storing seeds for your garden.
Spaces are limited to 15, so

early booking is advised.

Thomastown Library will host a Family Friendly Story and Craft Session from 11:30am to 12:30pm. This relaxed, dropin event invites children and families to enjoy stories and creative activities togetherno booking required.

Callan and Urlingford Libraries will offer a relaxed, family-friendly environment with crafts, LEGO, and board games.

In Ferrybank Library, the focus is on community heritage. A coffee morning from 11am to 12:30pm will invite locals to share stories and memories of South Kilkenny's past. Visitors can also explore the Irish Newspaper Archive, available free inbranch with a library card.

### Kilkenny Libraries Champion Sustainability During Ireland's SDG Week

SUSTAINABLE GOALS

Ikenny County Council Library Service is proud to take part in Ireland's fourth Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Week, running from 19th to 28th September 2025. SDG Week highlights the shared responsibility we all have in building a more sustainable future.

To mark the occasion, we will host a series of workshops across our branch network. Designed to inspire and empower library members to adopt more sustainable lifestyles, these events will explore practical ways to live more sustainably.

The vital role of hedgerows in our environment is explored through two engaging talks hosted by **Hedgerows Ireland**.

On Thursday, 25th September, Katie from Hedgerows Ireland will lead informative sessions in two library branches:

- Graiguenamanagh Library: 11:00am -12:30pm
- Thomastown Library: 2:00pm 3:30pm

These free events will highlight the ecological and cultural importance of Ireland's hedgerows, offering practical advice on how to plant and manage them in gardens, farms, and community green spaces. Attendees will also be encouraged to reflect on opportunities to enhance hedgerow health in their own local areas.

#### Cleaner, Greener Living

Join **Aoife Munn** for two hands-on workshops focused on creating a **Cleaner**, **Greener Home and Garden**.

These engaging sessions will explore sustainable cleaning solutions, with

attendees invited to make and test eco-friendly products during the workshop. Participants who bring clean containers can take home samples of the products they create.

- Mayfair Library: 12:00pm - 1:00pm Booking essential

Ferrybank Library will host a special craft workshop for children aged 8 to 12 on Friday, 26th September, from 3:15pm to 4:15pm.

The session will focus on creating fun and imaginative crafts using **eco-friendly and recycled materials**. Children will learn the basics of sustainable crafting and discover creative ways to reuse everyday items.

On Friday September 26th, Urlingford Library will host a soap-making workshop for adults at 11:00am, Participants will learn how to create their own eco soap or shampoo bars, using natural ingredients in a fun and practical session that promotes sustainable alternatives to everyday products.

Callan Library will run a children's soap-making workshop at 3:30pm, specially designed for ages 8 to 12. Young participants will enjoy crafting their own eco-friendly soap bars while learning about sustainability and the importance of reducing waste.

Weaving Sustainability: Children's Craft Workshop at Graiguenamanagh Library



Graiguenamanagh Library will host a creative weaving craft workshop for children aged 9 to 12 on Wednesday, 24th September, from 2:45pm to 3:45pm. The session will use do-

nated wool from Cushendale Woollen Mills and teach children how to make their own cardboard looms and weave colourful wool coasters. The workshop introduces the basics of weaving and encourages sustainable crafting using recycled and locally sourced materials.
